Expression of Interest Boards Register

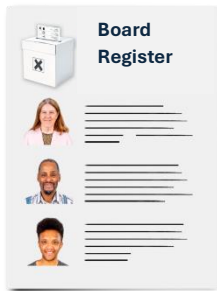


The Northern Territory Government are looking for people who are interested in being on **boards**.



Boards are a group of people who make decisions or provide advice on services delivered by Government.

Northern Territory is also known as the NT.



The NT Government wants more people to join the **EOI boards register**.

An EOI is an Expression of Interest.

This is when you show you are interested in something by:

- Sharing your skills.
- Sharing your knowledge.
- Wanting to help your community.

The register is the list of people who have said they are interested.

What do government boards do?



Government boards are made under a law or by a **minister**.



A minister is a person who is in charge of a government department.

They may manage things like:



- **Assets.**

Assets are things owned by the Government.



These can be things like:

- Equipment.
- Money.
- Buildings.



- Deciding a person's work rights, like:
 - **Licensing** plumbers.
Licensing is when you have permission to do something.
 - Hearing **appeals** against government decisions.
Appeals are when you ask the court to change their mind on a decision.

- Give ideas on areas of business such as:
 - **Sacred sites.**
A place with deep meaning to Aboriginal people.
 - Water.
 - Land management.
 - Environment.





- Health.
- Education.
- Housing.
- Tourism.
- Bushfire management.
- Youth justice.
- Arts and culture.
- Fisheries.

Why you should register to be on a board.



It is important to have a **diverse** range of members on government boards.

Diverse means lots of different people of different backgrounds that reflect the population.



This helps deliver government services that reflect the needs of the community.



Registering your interest helps agencies to find the right people for a board.

Who can register to be on a board?



You can register your interest to be on a government board if you:



- Are an Australian **citizen**.

A citizen is a person who legally lives in a country and has their rights protected.



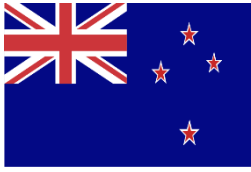
- Have **permanent residency** in Australia.

Permanent residency is a person's legal right to live in a country.



- Have a **visa** that says you can work in Australia.

Visa is a form that says you are allowed to enter and stay in a country.



- Are a New Zealand citizen with Special Category visa that says you can live and work in Australia.



Government **agencies** will interview people to see if they are the right person for a board.

Agencies are the different departments of the government.



An **interpreter** can be organised if needed.

An interpreter is someone that can communicate with you in your language.

Are board members paid?



Members may get paid for being on a board.

The amount you get paid is different for different boards.

1. Go to the NT Government jobs website.

2. Type in vacancy number 11170061

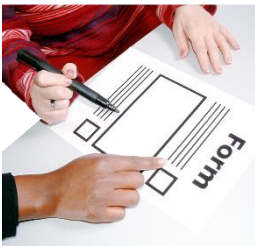

3. Fill out a Registration form.

This form tells us:

- Information about you.
- What you are interested in.
- Your skills.



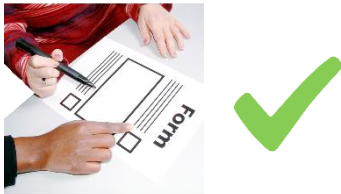
4. You will need to include your **curriculum vitae**.

This is also known as a CV or resume.



A curriculum vitae is a document that has information about your:

- Education.
- Job and volunteering roles.
- Qualifications.



Aboriginal people can still register their interest if they do not have a CV.

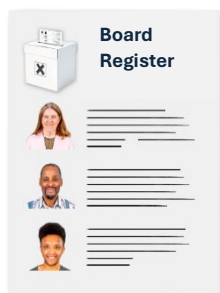


5. Submit your Registration form and your CV online.

After I submit my expression of interest.



After you submit your EOI you will get an email to say it has been received.



When a board vacancy opens up NT Government agencies look at the Register.

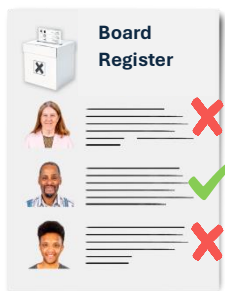


If you are the right fit for a board an agency official may contact you by:
