Implementing the Cross-Government Principles

Tips and links to get started

Principle 1 Shared Vision

 Review annual and strategic plans of <u>local government</u> <u>councils</u> and <u>NTG agencies</u> to find and strengthen alignment. Note: under the *Local Government Act 2019*, councils are required to have an annual area plan.

Principle 2 Collaborative Decision-Making

- Attend regional coordination committees, local service delivery committees, regional economic growth committees, local council and local authority meetings.
- LGANT hold two conventions each year. Most council CEOs and many elected representatives attend these events
- Use council key contacts, NTG agency champions and DCM regional executives to identify opportunities, meeting schedules and to add agenda items.

Principle 3 Improving the Wellbeing of all Northern Territory Residents

- Partner across governments on community identified priorities, including local organisations to maximise resources and build community capacity to deliver services.
- Include key NTG agencies and local government councils in joint planning, service implementation and reviews.
- Use the <u>NT Social Outcomes Framework</u> to assist alignment with local priorities and identify success.
- Use <u>Closing the Gap</u> outcomes to support innovation and program development.

Principle 4 Shared Information, Knowledge and Data

- Share / present authorised agency data at joint meetings to enhance shared planning, priority-setting and reviews.
- Include key NTG agencies and local government councils in joint planning, service implementation and reviews.
- Continue the commitment to work to the <u>principles of</u> open data.



Principle 5 Meaningful and Accessible Community Engagement

- Partner on community consultations and surveys to share opportunities, avoid duplication and deliver results to communities
- Find out about <u>local council committees and local</u> <u>authorities</u> – they offer opportunities to engage with key leaders and local experts.
- Undertake Territory-focused remote engagement training

Principle 6 Appropriate Timelines

 Share project schedules across governments and update at council, local authority and regional coordination meetings.

Principle 7 Agreed Communication and Engagement Protocols

- Identify project or program key contacts in local councils and NTG agencies, be clear on their authority and delegation.
- Use <u>Aboriginal Interpreter Services</u> and provide information in local languages (written and oral) to enhance consultations.
- Know who the local Traditional Owner groups are and how to engage appropriately. Land Councils can provide advice:
