Why you should register to be a board member

- It's important to have Aboriginal people on government boards who want to share their knowledge, skills and experience to help in decision making.
- We need more Aboriginal people to be on the Expression of Interest (EOI) NTG Boards Register. This helps the government know who to ask to be on a board.

Register your interest to be a board member

1. Complete the attached Expression of Interest (EOI) NTG Boards Registration Form and email it to boardremuneration@nt.gov.au
2. Log into the NT Government Jobs website, jobs.nt.gov.au and type **BOARDS** in the keyword search. Fill out the registration form and upload it with your resume/CV.
3. Phone 8999 7865 if you need help to register.

Remember

1. Tick the box if you need an interpreter at the interview.
2. Include a phone number where we can contact you.
3. Attach your resume/CV when you upload your registration form.

What do government boards do?
